



Curbside Recycling

General Instructions

- To avoid theft, store recycling containers in a secure area.
- Place recycling containers on the curbside before 6am the morning of your regularly scheduled refuse collection day.
- Only place recycling containers out for collection when one or both containers are full.
- Separate recyclables by using one container for newspaper and the other container for other recyclables (glass, plastic, tin and aluminum)



How To Sort Materials For Collection

Yellow Container



Glass- All colors of beverage bottles and food jars



Aluminum and Tin Cans- Aluminum beverage cans, tin cans (canned vegetables, soup cans, etc)



Plastic- Plastic *beverage* containers with recycling symbols 1-7

Green Container



Newspaper- Including any advertising inserts that come with the newspaper

Corrugated Cardboard- When flattened and broken down into 3 foot bundles, corrugated cardboard boxes may be placed at the curb line for recycling. Place the cardboard bundles alongside the newspaper container

Items Not Acceptable For Collection

Metals- scrap metal and auto parts

Glass- vases, bakeware, drinking glasses, ceramic dishes, florescent light tubes, broken window glass

Plastic- *non-beverage* containers with recycling symbols 3-7, including plastic bags, black potting containers, toys, laundry baskets, microwave dinner trays, butter tubs

Paper- catalogs, direct mail, office paper, envelopes, tissues, paper towels, paper bags
