SUBJECT: **AUTHORIZATION TO AWARD A CONTRACT FOR THE ANNUAL OVERLAY PROJECT FY 2009-2010**

SYNOPSIS

Staff recommends that the City Council award a contract in the amount of \$2,180,588.29 to TC Construction of Santee for the Annual Overlay Project FY 2009-10 located on various streets within the City; and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement upon receipt of all supporting documents.

BACKGROUND

Each fiscal year, a construction contract is prepared for the replacement and restoration of surface streets and other asphalt-related items as part of a continuing program to improve public roadways.

On July 1, 2009, the City Council approved the plans and specifications for the Annual Overlay Project FY 2009-10 and authorized a call for bids. The staff report included the complete list of streets to be repaired (see exhibit A) including portions of College Boulevard. Because the Emergency Sewer Replacement project is complete on Oceanside Boulevard between I-5 and Crouch Street, repaving of this section is included in this contract. Notices inviting sealed bids were sent to qualified area contractors and were also advertised in local newspapers, trade journals, and Web sites in accordance with City's standard bidding procedures.

ANALYSIS

The project consists of the removal and replacement of worn asphalt and a two-inch-thick cap of new asphalt on various arterials (plus six residential streets) Citywide. The asphalt used for the new surface is manufactured partially from recycled automobile tires. This product performs well for the City, is cost-competitive, reduces road noise and helps dispose of unwanted tires.

Restoration needs were determined by citizens' reports of deteriorating asphalt and related items, and staff's review to determine high priorities for restoration.

The bids were publicly opened on August 31, 2009; thirteen bids were received.

The lowest qualified bidder is TC Construction of Santee, with a bid of \$2,180,588.29. Their credentials have been researched and found to meet City requirements. The bid was reviewed and found to be complete. Construction is anticipated to begin in November and finish in February 2010. Night work is scheduled on Oceanside Boulevard and on College Boulevard between 8:00 p.m. – 5:00 a.m.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated project cost, including the base construction contract award and a 10 percent contingency for staff time and quantity overages, is \$3,000,000. The CIP project (902754200212) has a current available balance of \$7,082,843 which includes \$4,112,055 in FY 2008-09 carry forward funds. Therefore, sufficient funds are available.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The City's standard insurance requirements will be met.

COMMISSION OR COMMITTEE REPORT

Does not apply.

CITY ATTORNEY'S ANALYSIS

Contracts for public projects in excess of \$5,000 must be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. "Responsible bidder" is defined as a bidder who has demonstrated the attributes of trustworthiness as well as quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform a public works contract. The City Council also has discretion to reject all bids and re-advertise.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council award a contract in the amount of \$2,180,588.29 to TC Construction of Santee for the Annual Overlay Project FY 2009-10 located on various streets within the City; and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement upon receipt of all supporting documents.
