SUBJECT: **AUTHORIZATION TO AWARD A CONTRACT FOR THE MARSHALL PARK STORM DRAIN PROJECT**

## **SYNOPSIS**

Staff recommends that the City Council award a contract in the amount of \$82,228.45 to Ted Company of San Clemente for the Marshall Park Storm Drain Project; and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement upon receipt of all supporting documents.

## **BACKGROUND**

On August 12, 2009, the City Council approved the plans and specifications for the Marshall Park Storm Drain Project and authorized a call for bids. Notices inviting sealed bids were sent to qualified area contractors and were also advertised in local newspapers and trade journals, and Web sites in accordance with the City's standard bidding procedures.

## **ANALYSIS**

This contract provides for removal of deteriorated corrugated metal pipe beginning at an inlet in Lucky Street and ending at an obsolete catch basin in Marshall Park. New reinforced concrete pipe, concrete cleanouts, catch basins and headwalls will also be constructed. In the same vicinity, a broken drainage outlet in the Loma Alta Creek channel will be replaced with a new headwall and flap gate.

Bids were publicly opened on September 17, 2009; twenty-four (24) bids were received:

The lowest responsible bidder is Ted Company of San Clemente, with a bid of \$82,228.45. Their credentials have been researched and found to meet City requirements. The bid was reviewed and found to be complete. Construction is anticipated to begin in November and finish December 2009.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The estimated project cost, including the base construction contract award and staff time is approximately \$100,000. The current balance in the CIP project account (902522100212) is \$119,495. The source of the funds is Transnet carried forward from the FY 2008-09 budget. Therefore, sufficient funds are available.

**INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

The City's standard insurance requirements will be met.

**COMMISSION OR COMMITTEE REPORT**

Does not apply.

**CITY ATTORNEY'S ANALYSIS**

Contracts for public projects in excess of \$5,000 must be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. "Responsible bidder" is defined as a bidder who has demonstrated the attributes of trustworthiness as well as quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform a public works contract. The City Council also has discretion to reject all bids and re-advertise.

**RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the City Council award a contract in the amount of \$82,228.45 to Ted Company of San Clemente for the Marshall Park Storm Drain Project, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement upon receipt of all supporting documents.


