SUBJECT: **ADOPTION OF RESOLUTIONS CONFIRMING THE DIAGRAMS AND ASSESSMENTS FOR FY 2007-08 FOR THE DOUGLAS PARK LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE DISTRICT**

SYNOPSIS

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the resolution confirming the diagrams and assessments for the Douglas Park Landscape Maintenance District, Assessment District 5-1981 and order the assessments to be levied for FY 2007-08.

BACKGROUND

The Douglas Park Landscape Maintenance District (hereinafter "District") was formed pursuant to the authority granted by the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 of the California Streets and Highways Code. This legislation provided the means to finance the maintenance of landscape improvements within the boundaries of the District.

The FY 2007-2008 assessment for the District will be increased by two percent for Douglas Park and three percent for the Vandegrift Corridor, Zone A, which is part of the Douglas Park District. This increase was agreed to by a majority of property owners within the District, and as such, a proposition 218 balloting is not necessary. A comparative summary of the existing and proposed assessments for the District is shown in the fiscal impact portion of this report.

ANALYSIS

The City Council is required to conduct a public hearing regarding the proposed FY 2007-08 assessments to be levied within the District. The public hearing provides all interested persons an opportunity to be heard, either in writing or orally at the public hearing, regarding the renewal and proposed assessments. After consideration of the evidence submitted, the City Council is requested to adopt the resolution for the District confirming the FY 2007-08 diagram and assessment.

The amount of the assessment levied against a parcel is based on benefit unit costs. Benefit units are assigned to each parcel reflecting both land use designation and proximity to District landscaping. The District's total costs, divided by the total benefit

units in the District, determines the assessment per benefit unit. A parcel's assessment is determined by multiplying its assigned number of benefit units by the assessment per benefit unit.

Single-family homes are assessed one benefit unit. An additional 0.1 benefit unit is assessed if the single-family home is adjacent to District landscaping. Condominiums and apartments are assigned 0.8 benefit unit per dwelling.

An itemized outline of costs and the calculation of the average annual assessment per benefit unit are summarized in the attached Engineer's Report, approved on April 4, 2007, and the accompanying exhibits. The report identifies the proposed assessment for each lot and parcel of real property within the District. Exhibit C of the Engineer's Report contains an assessment roll showing the proposed amount to be assessed against each parcel within the District. The proposed assessments within the Engineer's Reports will be used to pay the operation, maintenance, and material costs associated with the District for FY 2007-08. Exhibit C is available for review in the City Clerk's office. Since there will not be any changes to the Engineer's Report approved on April 4, 2007, the City Council is not required to approve a Modified Engineer's Report. The proposed assessments within the Engineer's Report, approved on April 4, 2007, will be used to pay the operation, maintenance and material costs associated with the District for FY 2007-08.

FISCAL IMPACT

All costs are included in the District's budget. Revenues to cover the estimated expenditures are levied and collected as a special assessment against the properties within the District. The budget for the District is detailed on Exhibit B of the Engineer's Report. A comparative summary of the existing and proposed assessments for the District is shown below:

An annual increase to the base assessment rate by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all Urban Consumers for the San Diego Area was approved by a majority of the property owners within the District with City Council approval. The total annual

assessment will not exceed the maximum rate unless a balloting process in compliance with Proposition 218 is completed. All of the assessments approved by the City Council were prepared in accordance with the 1972 Act and are in full compliance with the provisions of the California Constitution Article XIID (Proposition 218).




RECOMMENDATION



7 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, Part 2 of
8 Division 15 of the Streets and Highways Code of California, Section 22500 et seq.,
9 hereinafter referred to as the "Act", the City Council of the City of Oceanside adopted
10 Resolution No. declaring its intention to levy and collect assessments for
11 fiscal year 2007-2008 to pay the maintenance, operation and administrative costs for
12 landscaping and appurtenant improvements within the Douglas Park Landscape
13 Maintenance District, Assessment District No. 5-1981;

14 WHEREAS, said resolution also set a public hearing for May 16, 2007 at
15 6:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as possible, in the City Council Chambers located at
16 300 North Coast Highway, Oceanside, California, as the time and place to hear
17 protests and objections to the proposed assessment and renewal of said district;

18 WHEREAS, the City Clerk of the City of Oceanside has given notice of said
19 hearing by publishing the Resolution of Intention, as required by Section 22626 of the
20 Act;

21 WHEREAS, at the time and place stated in said Resolution of Intention, the
22 public hearing was duly continued to June 6, 2007 by the City Council of the City of
23 Oceanside, at which time all persons desiring to be heard were heard;

24 WHEREAS, the Engineer's Report for the Douglas Park Landscape
25 Maintenance District was approved by the Oceanside City Council on April 4, 2007,
26 and no changes have been made to that report.

27 WHEREAS, said Report on file with the City Clerk of the City of Oceanside,
28 contains a full and detailed description of the boundaries of the assessment district,
the proposed assessments to be levied against each assessable lot or parcel of land
within the district, and a description of the improvements to be maintained or modified;

1 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Oceanside, adopted Resolution
2 No. which approved the Engineer's Report regarding the district's
3 proposed 2007-2008 costs and assessments;

4 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Oceanside has examined and
5 considered the proposed assessment in said Report and proceedings prior thereto, in
6 addition to the evidence presented at said hearing; and

7 WHEREAS, upon completion of said hearing, the City Council of the City of
8 Oceanside determined that a majority protest did not exist.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Oceanside does resolve as
10 follows:

11 SECTION 1. That on June 6, 2007, at 6:00 p.m., said hearing on the
12 proposed 2007-2008 fiscal year assessment and renewal was duly held, and each and
13 every step required under the Act and the California Constitution to levy said
14 assessment and renew said district in the proceedings prior to and including said
15 hearing has been duly taken.

16 SECTION 2. That this City Council does determine that the Engineer's
17 Report, approved by its Resolution No. and the amount of the assessment
18 rates shown in said Report, should be confirmed.

19 SECTION 3. That the City Council does determine that the amounts to be
20 assessed against the individual parcels shown on the assessment diagram contained
21 in said Report are approved and confirmed, and the City Clerk of the City of Oceanside
22 is directed to endorse upon the Engineer's Report for the Douglas Park Landscape
23 Maintenance District its approval and the date thereof.

24 SECTION 4. The City Clerk of the City of Oceanside is directed to file said
25 diagram and assessment as required by Section 22641 of the Act.









FISCAL YEAR 2007-2008

As directed by the City Council of the City of Oceanside, I, Scott Smith, Acting City Engineer, respectfully submit the following report regarding the 2007-2008 fiscal year renewal of the Douglas Park Landscape Maintenance District. This report is made pursuant to Article 4 of Chapter 1 of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, being Part 2 of Division 15 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California. This report consists of four parts (Exhibits "A" through "D") defined as follows:

- Exhibit "A" - Description of the improvements to be administered and maintained. The plans and specifications for these improvements are part of this report, but are separately bound and on file in the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department.
- Exhibit "B" - Cost estimate for the administration and maintenance of the improvements outlined in Exhibit "A".
- Exhibit "C" - An assessment roll showing the proposed amount to be specifically assessed against each lot or parcel of real property within the assessment district. Each parcel is described by San Diego County Assessor's Parcel Number or other designation, and each parcel has been assigned said number for the purposes of this proceeding. The amount assessed is based on Exhibit B".
- Exhibit "D" - Diagram showing the boundaries of the assessment district, parcels of real property within the district, and the location of the improvements. The diagram is keyed to Exhibit "C" by County Assessor's Number. The assessment roll and maps of the San Diego County Assessor shall govern for all details concerning the description, lines or dimensions of any lot or parcel shown.

The proposed assessments shall be used to pay for district administrative costs and the maintenance and material costs incurred to maintain landscaping and appurtenant structures within the parkways, medians and slopes within or adjacent to certain sections of Douglas, Marblehead Bay and Westport drives and North River Road, and between or along certain residential streets within those areas commonly known as Foxwood, Whelan Ranch, Creekside Estates and Sunwest Estates, Oceanside 1 and Darwin Estates subdivisions.

**VANDEGRIFT ANNEXATION
ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 5-1981
DESCRIPTION OF THE IMPROVEMENTS
TO BE ADMINISTERED AND MAINTAINED**

The Vandegrift Annexation is part of the Douglas Park Landscape Maintenance District, Assessment District 5-1981. The proposed assessments shall be used to pay for district administrative costs and the maintenance and material costs incurred to maintain landscaping with the parkways, medians, and slopes within or adjacent to certain sections of North River Road from North College Boulevard to North Redondo Drive, Vandegrift Boulevard from North Redondo Drive to Vandegrift Heights/Sonoma Hills, Vandegrift Boulevard adjacent to Sonoma Hills, Vandegrift Boulevard between Sonoma Hills and Morrow Hills West, Vandegrift Boulevard between Morro Hills West and Wilmont Ranch, and Vandegrift Boulevard adjacent to Wilmont Ranch






