SUBJECT: **RESOLUTION ACCEPTING \$2,000 IN GRANT FUNDS FROM THE NORTH COASTAL PREVENTION COALITION**

SYNOPSIS

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution accepting \$2,000 in grant funds from the North Coastal Prevention Coalition awarded to the City of Oceanside to support programs that reduce youth access to alcohol and drugs; authorizing the City Manager, Chief of Police or their designee to execute grant documents; approving the grant budget; appropriating the funds to the Police Department; and approving a Letter of Agreement between the Oceanside Police Department and the Vista Community Clinic which will act as fiscal agent.

BACKGROUND

The White House Office of National Drug Control Policy has identified the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs as a continuing problem throughout the nation. While federal and state agencies work to reduce the production, importation and distribution of such illegal drugs as cocaine, heroin, methamphetamines, it is up to local law enforcement agencies to deal with access to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs by youth. Alcohol use remains the single greatest substance abuse problem among youth. Many of the youth gain access to alcohol and other drugs in their homes or at house parties hosted by people who facilitate this illegal activity. The North Coastal Prevention Coalition (NCPC) works with local law enforcement agencies in Oceanside, Carlsbad and Vista to reduce youth access to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. NCPC provides funds to the Oceanside Police Department (OPD) for the services of sworn officers to direct and implement these enforcement activities aimed at reducing youth access.

ANALYSIS

The use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs by youth poses a danger to their health, safety and overall well-being. Reducing youth access to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs is a primary means by which the use of these harmful substances by youth can be reduced. NCPC has awarded OPD \$2,000 to promote prevention and suppression efforts with regards to the Social Host Ordinance adopted by the City of Oceanside. The Vista Community Clinic (VCC) acts as fiscal agent for the NCPC; VCC requires an annual Agreement between the parties as a condition of funding. The funds will be available until September 15, 2010.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Police Department plans to use the funds as follows:

The funding will cover the overtime costs associated with enforcement activities. It is anticipated that all salary expenses will be covered by the grant funding. Any other expenses have already been included in the FY 2010-11 Police Department budget and will not require additional funds.

The Vista Community Clinic will reimburse the City of Oceanside for overtime worked by officers to plan and carry out enforcement of the City's Social Host Ordinance. The grant funds will be deposited into OPD Private Grant Account #917443100276.4376 sub ledger account # 100531, and appropriated as detailed above.

COMMISSION OR COMMITTEE REPORT

The Oceanside Community Safety Partnership Committee was advised of this matter at their meeting on August 11, 2010, and gave their support for this project. The Police and Fire Commission will be advised of this matter at its regular monthly meeting on August 19, 2010.

CITY ATTORNEY'S ANALYSIS

The referenced documents have been reviewed by the City Attorney and approved as to form.

RECOMMENDATION



23 Prevention Coalition.

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
