SUBJECT: **RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OCEANSIDE
AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF USED OIL PAYMENT PROGRAM
APPLICATIONS**

SYNOPSIS

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing application to the State of California for grant funds to support recycling of used oil and proper disposal of household hazardous waste.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), formerly known as the California Integrated Waste Management Board, has established the Used Oil Payment Program (OPP) to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions for implementation of their used oil programs. Under delegation by the State Legislature, CalRecycle has enacted a number of programs to encourage recycling, to divert waste materials from landfills, and to provide for proper disposal of hazardous waste, including household hazardous wastes such as paint and aerosol containers. In fact the Used Oil Payment Program (OPP) is derived from the original Used Oil Block Grant program that has been awarded to the City since 1994. The OPP program replaces the Used Oil Block Grant Program.

The City of Oceanside has applied for and received both direct allocations and competitive grant awards through these programs. The City currently works with Waste Management of North County to provide used oil and household hazardous waste collection programs for Oceanside residents. The grants have also provided funds for community education programs on recycling, proper disposal of wastes, and pollution prevention.

ANALYSIS

The City is an eligible applicant for grant funds from CalRecycle, and has programs in place to collect used oil and household hazardous waste from residents.

CalRecycle OPP program requires a resolution from the governing body of an applicant jurisdiction authorizing application for such grant funds, and allows a single resolution to

cover all such grant applications annually, until rescinded by the City. The resolution authorizes application for grant funds, but the City Council retains authority to accept or to reject individual grants when budget resolutions for individual grants are presented to the Council for approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The resolution authorizes application for grant funds to support local programs to collect and recycle used oil, and to collect and dispose of household hazardous wastes. The programs provide services to residents of the City without impact on the General Fund. Any grants requiring matching funds will be presented to the Council for approval.

CITY ATTORNEY'S ANALYSIS

The referenced documents have been reviewed and approved as to form by the City Attorney

COMMITTEE OR COMMISSION REPORT

The Integrated Waste Commission has reviewed the City's used oil collection and recycling program, and the household hazardous waste collection and disposal program. The Commission recommends that the City apply for all appropriate grant funds to support such programs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing application to the State of California for grant funds to support recycling of used oil and proper disposal of household hazardous waste.

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

5 WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Resources Code § 48690 the Department of Resources
6 Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), formerly known as the California Integrated Waste
7 Management Board, has established the Used Oil Payment Program to make payments to
8 qualifying jurisdictions for implementation of their used oil programs; and

9 WHEREAS, in furtherance of this authority CalRecycle is required to establish
10 procedures governing the administration of the Used Oil Payment Program; and

11 WHEREAS, CalRecycle's procedures for administering the Used Oil Payment Program
12 require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain
13 authorizations related to the administration of the Used Oil Payment Program.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Oceanside authorizes the
15 submittal of a Used Oil Payment Program application to CalRecycle; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager, or his/her designee, is hereby
17 authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City of Oceanside all documents,
18 including but not limited to, applications, agreements, annual reports including expenditure
19 reports and amendments necessary to secure said payments to support the City of Oceanside's
20 Used Oil Collection Program; and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this authorization is effective until rescinded by the
22 City Council of the City of Oceanside.
