TRAINING & PUBLIC EVENTS

EOC Training: Members of the city EOC attended EOC training down at San Diego County Office of Emergency Services (OES). Future training sessions will occur throughout the next few months.

EOC Relocation: Plans to relocate the City's EOC are underway. The new location of the EOC will be in the traffic office. The EOC will be much better served having access to the city hall facilities and the new traffic cameras placed throughout the city.

Fire House Dinner: Fire station 6 hosted a charity dinner on July 24th. The Oceanside Firefighters Association donates fire house dinners to various charities in town. For more information please contact the OFA directly.

ACLS Recertification: The entire fire department was recertified in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) in the month of July. Recertification is required by all paramedics every two years.

Confined Space Recertification: The entire fire department was recertified in Confined Space Rescue in the month of July. Confined Space Rescue is an OSHA requirement and the training allows personnel to enter confined spaces (electrical vaults, sewer pipes, etc) to perform rescues.

School/Youth Group Fire Station Visits: In July OFD hosted 2 fire station visits from local children's groups. Fire station visits are tailored to the age of the children attending. Kids are given a tour of the station, demonstrations of all the apparatus and fire gear, and given an overview of fire safety and 911.

CERT Training. Oceanside CERT held a monthly training session at the fire training center.

Camp Pendleton Fire School. Oceanside sent 3 units in June to the annual CP Fire School. Live brush fire training and fire line safety training was provided for agencies throughout Southern California.
