## TRAINING & PUBLIC EVENTS

**Pub-Ed, Station Visits, School Visits:** The OFD participated in 5 outreach programs in August. Station visits, school site visits or other public education programs are a key element to our fire prevention program.

**Multi-Company Ventilation Training:** All members and crews participated in a 3 hour ventilation training at the Fire Training Center. Crews practiced roof ventilation techniques for both commercial and residential building types.

**DMV Mandatory Driving Training:** In order to be licensed to drive fire apparatus all personnel must go through an annual DMV driving test. The OFD conducted this driver training throughout the month of August.

**Live Fire Training:** We conducted three live fire drill burns on the empty land in El Corazon. Wildland season is upon us and this training was critical to refreshing our skills on a wildland incident.

**Ladder Truck Training:** The OFD will be receiving a new tractor-trailer “tiller” truck towards the end of the year. Training on this new type of apparatus has begun in preparation for its arrival. Encinitas Fire Department, which has a similar ladder truck, has been gracious enough to train our personnel at no cost. The City of Orange will also be donating an old ladder truck to us to use for training prior to our new truck’s arrival. The City of Orange was planning on donating the retired truck to Mexico, but has allowed us to use it for a few more months before it heads south of the border.

**Auto Extrication Training:** All personnel went through three hours of auto extrication training. It is important to continue to train on extrication techniques as technology changes the cars on the road. Hybrids, electric cars and other new designs have proven to be very dangerous to emergency responders without proper knowledge and training.

**Hoffman Memorial Scholarship:** The OFA presented Chris Tucker Jr. with the inaugural Michael Hoffman Memorial Scholarship for \$500. Chris is in pursuit of a career in the fire service and will put the scholarship towards that goal. Michael Hoffman was tragically killed in a car crash last year weeks before his high school graduation. He is the son of retired OFD member Bill Hoffman.
