


## Student Environmental Film Contest Rules

To be eligible students must be living in or attending school in the City of Oceanside and be in grades kindergarten through 12. Proof may be required.

- Films must be original or public domain.
- Films must be solely produced by students.
- Entries must have a signed media release for all persons appearing in the film. No persons may appear in the film unknowingly. Respect people's privacy.
- Contest entry forms and media releases are available for download at [www.oceansiderecycles.org](http://www.oceansiderecycles.org).
- Films may be individual or group.
- Films must be no longer than 3 minutes.
- Films must be uploaded to YouTube and have a url.
- The content must comply with a G rating and be suitable for all audiences.
- Judging Criteria
  - How well does the film teach the audience?
  - How well is the theme clearly presented?
  - Is the theme of an environmental nature?
  - To what extent is the information and facts being interestingly portrayed in the film?
