TRAINING & PUBLIC EVENTS

Pub-Ed, Station Visits, School Visit, Ride-alongs: The OFD participated in 20 outreach programs in January. Station visits, school site visits and other public education programs are a key element to our fire prevention program.

Ladder Drill: All OFD personnel participated in multi-company drills with the focus on ground ladders.

ACLS/BLS CPR Course: OFD personnel took ACLS/CPR Instructor’s Class to allow in-house training of our members.

ToWizard Towing Company: Crews participated in a familiarization with the tow company ToWizard to better understand the company’s abilities to provide service on traffic accidents.

Palomar Academy: OFD personnel participated in the regional fire academy at Palomar College.

Blue Card Training/CTC: Fire crews continued the AFG-funded Blue Card Command Training at our Command Training Center.

Night Drill: The OFD conducted a multi-company night drill.

Aerial Ops Drill: OFD Personnel participated in an aerial ops rescue drill utilizing the ladder trucks to remove a victim from a rooftop.

Tiller Training: Crews participated in ongoing Tiller training operations.

Truss Test Burn: OFD training personnel conducted test burns on Truss systems to better understand the fail points and timing of roof construction.
