

WATERING DAYS LIMITED TO TWO (2) DAYS PER WEEK

Governor Brown’s first-ever executive order for mandatory water use reductions ranging from 4% to 36% is a clear indication that we need to step up our conservation efforts. To achieve Oceanside's assigned cutback of 20%, significant changes will need to be made, including reducing watering days to **two days per week** and eliminating water waste. It's more important than ever that everyone adhere to current Level 2 Drought restrictions and work together as a community to achieve our conservation targets. Thank you for doing your part to ensure we meet the State mandate and for helping to make Oceanside a more water efficient community.

Watering days limited to **Tuesdays and Saturdays** for Single-Family Residential Homes or **Mondays and Thursdays** for Apartments, Condos, Businesses, and Public Agencies.

Other Restrictions include:

- Only water outdoors on assigned watering days for no more than 10 minutes per sprinkler station per day.
- Water before 10:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m.
- No watering *during and 48 hours after* measurable precipitation.
- Adjust sprinklers to prevent runoff and overspray.
- Sweep paved surfaces; do not wash down with a hose.
- Repair all indoor and outdoor leaks.
- Turn off water fountains and other water features unless they use re-circulated water.
- Use a bucket and a hose with a shut-off valve for washing cars, and be careful not to allow any runoff that wastes water or adds pollutants to the storm drain. It is recommended that you visit a commercial car wash that re-circulates water.
- No irrigating turf in public street medians with potable water.
- Serve water to restaurant patrons only upon request.
- Offer hotel guests the option of not laundering towels and linens daily.

*Those not following these restrictions are subject to citation and subsequent fines.
