The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers awarded a \$3.7 million contract to Manson Construction Company of Seattle, Washington, on March 13, 2017 for the Oceanside Harbor Maintenance Dredging project.

The Corps' Los Angeles District issued a notice to proceed with an anticipated completion date of no later than May 26.

The contract calls for the removal of beach quality sand from the harbor's entrance channel and its placement along Oceanside's beaches.

Manson Construction has successfully dredged Oceanside Harbor in the past, and Corps officials anticipate no difficulties meeting the May 26 completion date.
