### What Home Means to Me Calendar Contest

As part of the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials' (NAHRO's) Housing America campaign, a poster contest is held each year. Children residing in affordable housing, assisted directly or supported under community development and affordable housing programs, submitted artwork on the national theme of "What Home Means to Me." National honorees are selected from chapter, state and region winning entries.

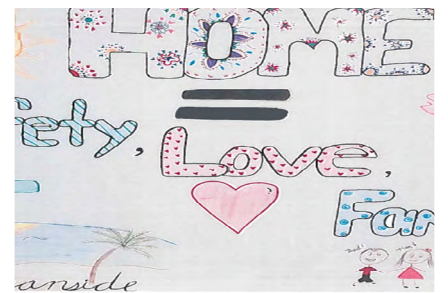
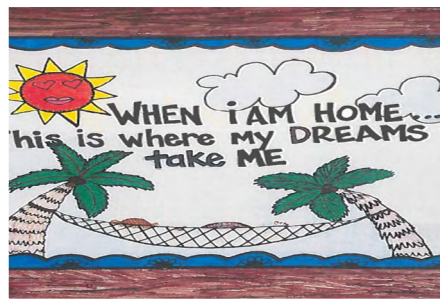
The City of Oceanside Neighborhood Services Department (a NAHRO member agency) held a local "What Home Means to Me" poster contest from February 1 to March 31, 2017, to generate entries to submit to the Southern California Chapter contest. Forty-six children entered posters in the contest.

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners in each category (elementary, middle and high school) were forwarded to the Southern California Chapter for judging.

Two of those entries were selected to advance to the Pacific Southwest Region competition for the next phase of judging; one of the entries was selected to compete at the National competition.

All eligible children who submitted an entry received a \$5 Subway gift card. There were three award winners in each age category. First prize winners received a \$150 Visa® gift card, second prize winners received a \$100 Visa® gift card and third prize winners received a \$50 Visa® gift card.
