



## SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

- A. Answer (briefly) the following questions (double-spaced, single-sided, 12-point font):
1. What degree do you intend to pursue and what are your career goals (if known)?
  2. What extracurricular programs, volunteer service or community activities have you been involved in during high school? List the activities (including work experience or internships) and approximately how long you have been involved in the activities.
  3. College costs are difficult for most families, especially in this time of economic recession in the nation. Many students face financial hardships or other difficulties that make it challenging to attend college. Please explain any hardships or difficulties that you or your family will face in going to college after graduation.
  4. Please list ALL scholarships, financial aid or other resources will you be receiving for the FAL18 school year.
  5. Please list ALL other scholarships that you have applied for and if selected the maximum amount that you could receive.
- B. Attach an essay (two pages maximum) concerning how the life, activity and teachings of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. have influenced you. More than what Dr. King did or the challenges that he faced, explain how the ideals of Dr. King have helped you develop your personal values and how you hope to live out these values in your life and career. Tell how his life and teachings have influenced you and how you have responded to challenges in your own life. Explain how you intend to put into practice the ideals of solving problems without the use of violence, promoting harmony and mutual respect among different groups, and working together to build up the community.  
(double-spaced, single-sided, 12-point font)
- C. Attach three letters of reference: One (1) from a teacher or faculty member at your school and two (2) from individuals who are familiar with your background, abilities, activities and your potential for success in college. Reference letters must include the name, address and phone number of the person providing the reference. Immediate family members and persons under 18 years of age may not provide letters of reference for you. Talk to the scholarship coordinator at your school if you have questions on who can provide letters of reference.
- D. Attach a copy of your transcript through the first semester of your senior year showing the classes you have taken and grades received. You can obtain the transcript through the scholarship coordinator at your school or from the front office. It does not have to be an "official" or sealed transcript.
- E. Make a copy of the complete application for your personal record.
