



“WHAT HOME MEANS TO ME” 2019 CALENDAR CONTEST

As part of National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials’ (NAHRO’s) Housing America campaign, a poster contest is held each year for children residing in affordable housing and community developments owned or administered by member agencies. Posters reflect the national theme of “What Home Means to Me.” The contest is a collaborative effort of NAHRO’s chapter/state, regional, and national organizations. National honorees are selected from chapter/state-level winning entries.

The City of Oceanside [Neighborhood Services Housing Department](#) (a NAHRO member agency) held a local “What Home Means to Me” poster contest from February 1 to March 15, 2018, to generate entries to submit to the contest.

The 1st prize winners in each category (elementary, middle and high school) were forwarded to the state chapter for judging. One of those entries has been elevated to the regional organization for the next phase of judging!

All eligible children who submitted an entry received a \$5 Subway gift card. First prize winners received a \$150 Visa gift certificate. Second prize winners received a \$100 Visa gift certificate and third prize winners received a \$50 gift certificate.
