Recycling your used oil and used oil filters helps protect our ocean and waterways. Motor oil is one of California's largest hazardous waste streams. As little as one gallon of improperly disposed motor oil can contaminate approximately one million gallons of drinking water with toxic substances. Improperly disposed oil filters have the potential to leach more than 2 million gallons of oil into the California environment, poisoning soil and watersheds.
