Oceanside Harbor Police Vessel Inspection Checklist

THE OWNER IS RESPONSIBLE TO LOCATE AND VERIFY ALL ITEMS BEFORE INSPECTION OR YOU WILL NOT PASS.

- 1. Current registration or documentation onboard. Must be able to locate Hull I.D. & Coast Guard Documentation number on vessel.
- 2. Vessel moves under its own power to the "Guest Check In" docks (slip #5, #6 or #7) in front of Harbor Office. All inboard engines must be operational.*
- 3. Adequate fire extinguishers onboard.
- 4. Adequate PFD's onboard.
- 5. Adequate sound producing device.
preferably a bell, horn or whistle
- 6. Visual distress signals.
- 7. Backfire flame arrestor (N/A to diesel engines).
- 8. Required Navigation and Anchor lights operational.
- 9. Operable Engine space ventilation system. (Gas Engines)
- 10. Proper marine sanitation devices are operational and any thru-hull shut off valve is closed. Dye tablet will be used to verify.
- 11. Bilge free from petroleum/corrosive products & fumes.
- 12. Vessel must be in good appearance.**
- 13. Dock lines safe, non-chafed and of adequate size for the vessel.
- 14. Display proper oil and trash placards.
- 15. **Mandatory CO-warning-stickers**

* Harbor Administrative Officer or his/her designee may request a demonstration of the vessel's operability and seaworthiness in open waters outside of the Harbor's entrance.

** As part of the inspection, the vessel must be in good appearance. Oceanside City Code Chapter 29A requires owners to maintain their vessel to ensure that it is not derelict, dilapidated or in badly deteriorated condition so as to create a blight in the Harbor.
